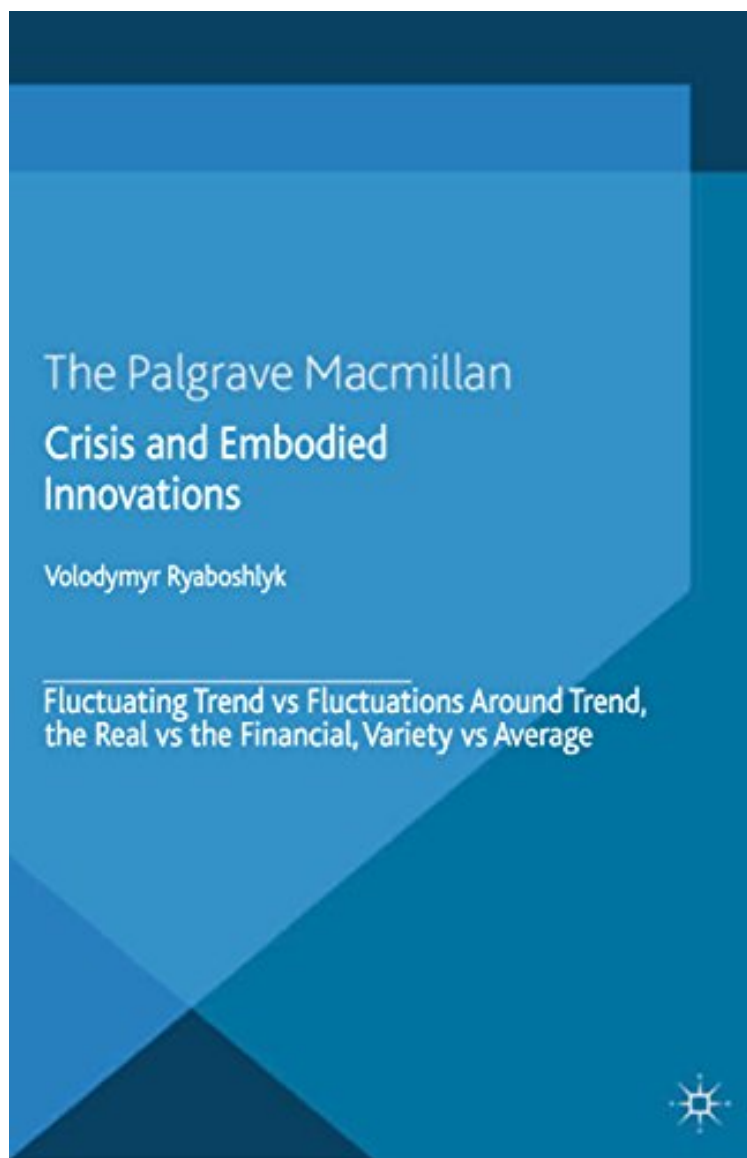

In his book "Crisis And Embodied Innovations"; the Ukrainian economist Volodymyr Ryaboshlyk offers an interesting and stimulating analysis of uneven growth and structural change driven by the spread of innovations. Volodymyr Vsevolodovych Ryaboshlyk is a Ukrainian economist who has had time to conduct research, teaching, publicist and governmental activities. In the aftermath of the Orange Revolution he held the position of Deputy Minister of Economy of Ukraine. He received his PhD at the Department of Economic Cybernetics at the Plekhanov Institute of the National Economy, Moscow, Russia; and his MSc in Computer Aided Management Systems (CAM systems) at Kharkiv Polytechnic Institute, Ukraine. He also took the Program for Senior Ukrainian Economists at the Economics Institute in Boulder, Colorado, USA. His abnormal ideas about a normal crisis were reported at many centres from Tokyo to Paris.
